### **MINUTE REPORT**



The event organizer was Scandinavian Human Rights Lawyers. The event was implemented on 11-12 September 2018 in Uppsala Sweden. The speakers' presentations alternated with interactive discussions on the rights of victims of crimes.

At the event attended Swedish, Romanian, Bulgarian experts, specialists with legal and social professional background. As speakers were present Ruth Nordström, Chief Lawyer Scandinavian Human Rights Lawyers, Fred Nyberg, Professor and senior lecturer, Uppsala University,

Vladislava Stoyanova, senior lecturer, phd in Law, Faculty of Law at Lunds University, Sweden, Annica Svensson, Police Authority, Sweden, Vlad Virgil, Social Authorities, Sweden, Elena Lazar Lawyer Bucharest Bar, Expert for Association Pro Refugiu (coordinator organization of the project), Desislava Victorova and Penka Stoyanova, Police Inspectors, Bulgaria, Miriana Ilcheva, Lawyer, Senior Analyst, Center for the Study of Democracy, Bulgaria, Charlotte Eklund Rimsten, Governmental Investigator, Sweden, Phd in Law.

The event was a good opportunity for Swedish, Romanian, Bulgarian participants to learn more on each country approach to support victims of crimes, the referral procedures to assist victims, how to ensure comprehensive information based on existing practices. An appropriate time was allocated to jointly discuss the dissemination strategies – methods and tools that are to be used in order to allow a proper access to information for victims and stakeholders (access to publications such as victims' booklet and referral mechanism paper). The discussions focused on how the information from the victims' booklet will reach a large number of victims (printed version, online, app for mobile phones, agreements protocols). The partners agreed to make the necessary efforts to contract as many stakeholders as possible (the ones that have a direct contact with victims of crimes): legal aid offices, courts, national council for assistance and compensation for victims, police units, NGOs, centers for crime prevention etc.
